Sarah writes: Amongst the most distinctive features of some Suffolk parish churches are their early fifteenth century to mid-sixteenth century open timber roofs. These were often designed with angelic carvings, some of which have been lost to iconoclasm.... Angel roofs proliferated across Suffolk in the wake of the unveiling of Richard II's prestigious remodelled roof at Westminster Hall. I will consider why Badingham's nave roof is an outstanding example.

Carol Service and Crib Service

It was lovely to be joined by so many people for the Carol Service and the Crib Service. Your generous donations meant that we collected £117.50 for The Children's Society to support their amazing work – thank you everyone who contributed and who came along and helped to make the services so special.

Badingham Church Roof Repairs

We were delighted early in December to be told that the Heritage Fund had increased our Development Fund Grant by £38,693 which will enable us to engage a fund-raising consultant, who will help us with grant applications, and a quantity surveyor. Both very necessary. They have also extended our Development Phase period and our aim is to submit our Delivery Phase Application by May 2026.



Arising from the Activity Plan, we have had a report from Suffolk Wildlife Trust and hope to have a meeting with everyone involved in the churchyard maintenance (when the weather and conditions permit) to discuss the churchyard management from a natural history point of view.

We are also arranging a talk on 'Angel Roof Churches in Suffolk', with a special reference to Badingham. Details of the talk are on page 9.

As always, thanks to The National Lottery Heritage Fund and lottery players for their support.

Just a reminder – there is a collection point for the Food Bank in the Church Chancel. Your contributions are greatly appreciated and very welcome.

Badingham

I received a tip-off that a white van was sitting around Low Street for some time before a burglary of a shed and garage. Fortunately, only a drill was taken this time but there have been a number of burglaries in nearby villages. May I remind everyone again to lock up sheds, install security lighting and keep an eye on your neighbours.

Heating Oil

We are now in winter and depend on our heating to keep us warm and cosy. Anyone receiving a delivery of heating fuel make sure you do the following:

- ÿ Install a lock on your tank cap
- ÿ Regularly check fuel levels
- ÿ Screen your tank with a fence or hedging
- ÿ Close and secure perimeter gates
- ÿ Conceal external pipework
- ÿ Install dusk to dawn security lighting
- ÿ Consider installing CCTV or a tank alarm

Large quantities of oil will need sizeable containers and a van or larger vehicle to take it away. Keep an eye on your property and report any suspicious incidents in the neighbourhood to the Police on 01473 613500 or 999 in an emergency.

Dog Owners

Complaints have been received of walkers with their dogs going through farmland and private property. Dog walkers make an important contribution to the vitality of the countryside but inconsiderate actions mean they can be treated as an unwelcome group. Following the Countryside Code of simple Dos and Don'ts, with the addition of common sense, will make the countryside experience much more positive for all.

Please (and this is not the first reminder) pick up your dog's mess and carry the bag home or to the nearest council bin. This is a New Year's resolution for many of you!

Drivers Eye Tests

As part of a new road safety strategy, new legislation is expected that will make it compulsory for drivers over 70 years to pass an eye test. Expect to visit an optician for a sight test when you renew your licence at 70 and every three years thereafter.
