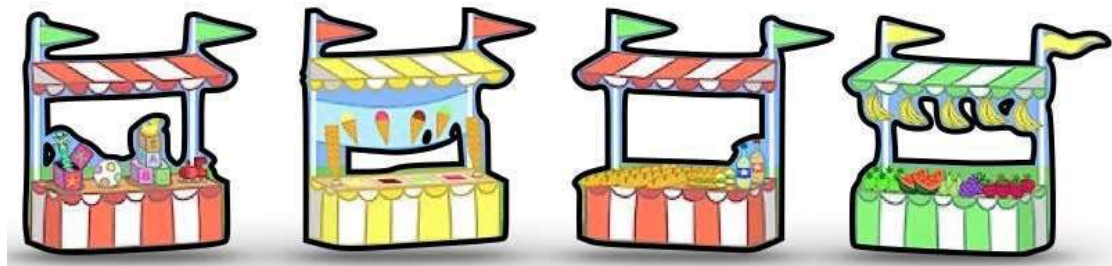

We are pleased to report that Badingham Church passed the Mid-Term Review of our Lottery application. It was a major event with specialists from Heritage, our Quantity Surveyor, Architect, Rector, PCC members and Steering Group members present in the village hall as well as our Activity Consultant, NHLF Chief of Finance and his Personal Assistant joining us online. A multitude of documents had previously been sent to The Heritage. Passing the Review means that we can now apply to the National Heritage Lottery for the Delivery Phase (the money to do the repairs). The application still requires a lot of work between now and the application deadline of 6th August.

I'm glad to say I haven't heard of many reports for Badingham of late.

Farm Fires

The cost of farm fires has rocketed to £23.5m in East Anglia alone. Rural insurers would like farmers to invest in new fire suppression systems to high-risk kit, such as combine harvesters, and prepare prevention and control plans. The leading causes of fire are electrical faults, arson and lightning strikes. The general public can do their bit by not littering – glass bottles, cigarette butts etc – and avoiding burning rubbish during hot, dry conditions.

Accident on A1120

On 29th June, a bad accident took place on the High Road. It involved a lorry and cars, with police and ambulance crew in attendance. This is a very fast stretch of road and cars overtaking in the dip are dangerous. Please take care when driving along the A1120.

Drugs – Essex

Once again, the Police have smashed a drugs gang in Essex. The drugs courier came from Colchester; transporting large amounts of cocaine and cash for the gangs. In May, he was sentenced to 5 years and 5 months behind bars. His conviction marks final sentencing in a complex, 2-year investigation that brought down an entire network. He joins 9 others, ranging from wholesale suppliers to street level dealers. Total prison sentences exceed 45 years.

On behalf of NHW, I would like to thank DI Frazer Low of the Serious and Organised Crime Unit for all the work done to keep drugs out of our communities.

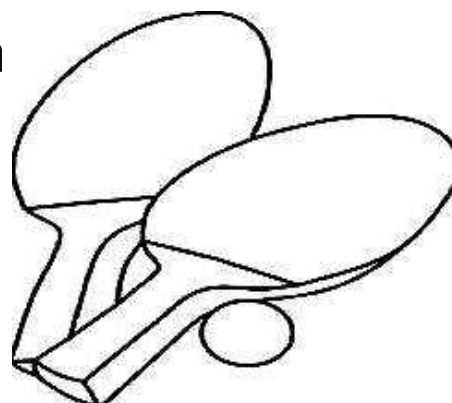
